










- We serve over 1.25 million people, nearly 25% of BC's population.

- 2020-2021: Conducted a Vulnerability and Capacity Assessment to inform our Climate Change and Health Adaptation Framework (Health Canada-funded)
- Data sources included:
 - www.climatedata.ca
 - Canada's Changing Climate Report (e.g., sea-level rise)
 - Grey and academic literature (e.g., wind)
 - Various sources for historical data (which can be very challenging)
 - Corroborated with existing projections reports (e.g., Metro Vancouver)






CLIMATE IMPACTS ON HEALTH AND THE HEALTH SYSTEM



EXTREME HEAT

- » Heat-related mortality
- » Heat-realted illnesses and hospital visits
- » Mental health effects
- » Overheating in facilities






- » Mental health effects
- » Poor air quality in facilities
- » Closures and evacuations



STORMS, FLOODING, POWER OUTAGES & LANDSLIDES

- » Injuries and mortality
- » Damage to facilities and infrastrucure
- » Health service disruptions
- » Impacts to water quality





- » Salination of groundwater sources
- » Coastal erosion, loss of ecosystems and cultural sites
- » Displacement during flood events



TEMPS

INFECTIOUS DISEASES

- » Increasing water- and food-borne diseases like Legionella and Vibrio
- » Uncertainty about future risk of vector-borne diseases like Lyme Disease
- » Increased risk of exposure when travelling to tropical locations

CHANGES TO ECOSYSTEMS

- » Longer droughts, warmer rivers, ocean acidification and warming
- » Food and water quality, safety and security (e.g. shellfish poisoning)
- » Decreasing access to traditional foods for Indigenous communities, as well as cultural impacts









Portfolio Climate Hazard Exposure Screen


Objectives

- Conduct high-level climate exposure screen for ~45 sites across VCH using myriad data
- Wildfire example
 - WUI (wildland urban interface) fire threat classification map
 - Wildfire occurrences (Western Canada) (paper)
 - Realized fire spread days (paper)
 - Wildfire smoke exposure number or percent of days over 25 ug/m3
- Uses a 1971-2000 baseline



Climate Projection Data for Health Regions

- Create and share resources and supports with our community partners:
 - Resources to help identify health impacts associated with heat and smoke events
 - Guidance documents for cooling centres, community-based wellness checks, restaurant operators, special events and schools
 - Gathering information about electricity outages, which increase risk significantly







ED Visits High Acuity Admissions Ages 70+ Visits

Distribution of ED Visits by Density












